

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).




This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Plumas Charter School expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Plumas Charter School is \$4,422,125, of which \$3,245,612 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$494,558 is other state funds, \$306,387 is local funds, and \$375,568 is federal funds. Of the \$3,245,612 in LCFF Funds, \$278,874 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

The LCFF gives school districts more flexibility in deciding how to use state funds. In exchange, school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) that shows how they will use these funds to serve students.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Plumas Charter School plans to spend for 2021-22. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

Plumas Charter School plans to spend \$4,365,332 for the 2021-22 school year. Of that amount, \$3,338,222 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$1,027,110 is not included in the LCAP. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the LCAP will be used for the following:


Not included in the LCAP expenditures are clerical salaries and benefits, payroll taxes, insurance, the school information system, school memberships and dues, SPED speech, Occupational Therapy and School Psychologist services.

#### Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2021-22 School Year

In 2021-22, Plumas Charter School is projecting it will receive \$278,874 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Plumas Charter School must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the LCAP. Plumas Charter School plans to spend \$510,629 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the LCAP.
